European Student Card / an Erasmus+ Strategic partnership

Strategic Partnerships are transnational projects designed to develop and share innovative practices and promote cooperation, peer learning, and exchanges of experiences in the fields of education, training, and youth.

- ESC Strategic partnership:
 - 1 coordinating institution, 8 core partners, 17 associated partners
 - 4 countries
 - Maximal grant amount: 299 981,00 €
 - Project co-funded for 2 years including 2 phases of implementation:
 - 1st: Development phase of ESC
 - 2^{ème}: Testing and deployment phase on experimental territories
 - 2 main outputs:
 - Conception of a platform / prototype to interconnect the HEI's information systems
 - Experimentation on specific territories: e.g. EUCOR The European campus







Structure of the ESC Strategic partnership




The network of Student services in France

CNOUS: Paris

1 national training centre

Annual budget: 1.4 billion euros (excluding grants) / two-thirds are own resources generated by the activity (catering and accommodation)



Next to students

- **681.078** grant holders (+2,8%)
- More than 2.5 billions euros of state funding for grants on the basis of social criteria

- More than 650 university restaurants and cafeterias

French National Student Card Committee



January 6th, 2016: creation of the National Committee Student Card

- → Evolution of the **National Multi-service card** group created in 2009
- → Attached to the **Conference of Presidents of Universities** and the **Cnous**
- → Coordination with French Ministry of Higher Education (MESR/DGESIP)
- → 1 representative + bureau composed of 4 persons;
- → 1 permanent representation of approximately 35 people;
- → Mentioned in measures 8 and 9 of the National Student Life Plan (PNVE) :
 - Generalizing Multiservice Student Cards
 - Create a European Student Card;
- → Participation at national, European and international discussions.

- National tender for smart cards
- Implementation of the new electronic wallet IZLY
- Monitoring of uses and services
- Sharing experiences on Card Management Systems (CMS)
- Deployment of new card technologies
- Creation of a network of experts and specialists

2016/2017: more 1.5 million cards produced and sent to HEI



French National Student Card Committee

Currently deployed services:

→ Services offered to all students in all Institutions:

- the student smart card allowing the recognition of student status for the current academic year
- the electronic wallet IZLY (e-payment service offered by the Crous)

→ Specific services are offered to students in each HEIs:

- Access control
- Libraries services (borrowing of books ...)
- Reservation of rooms
- Photocopying / Printing
- Public transportation

→ New services must be developed:

- Mutualization of access to specific services
- Attendance at classes
- Endorsement of examinations
- Borrowing equipment
- e-Ticketing
- Electronic signature
- NFC and mobile applications

- ...

Principles:

- Operated directly by higher education institutions (HEIs) allowing federation of all HEI for students right recognition
- Build upon and extend existing systems
 - Many forms (paper, multiservice card,...)
 - Basic standardization around electronic component (if present)
 - Including a EU logo
- Shared information about the card holder at European scale
 - With as little impact as possible of institutions' Information systems
 - Facilitate the commitment of any institutions





Principle 1 : free decision of HEI

Joining the ESC system is up to HEIs and its participation may be cancelled at any time;

Principle 2 : free choice of students

Any student of an on ESC registered institution retains control over the exchange of data between HEIs.

Principle 3: autonomy of cards manufacturing process

Each institution retains full control of the creative process, production and delivery of its card. At least, HEI will have to:


- Put the "European student" logo on the front of the card
- Put on the card the minimum identification data needed for sharing the student status.





European student card fundamentals

A graphic « European Student » identity: Logo/hologram



- Interconnecting of European HEIs (data providers)
 - For sharing the student status between HEIs: common e-ID
 - For exchanging data between HEIs in order to simplify procedures and ensure access to services provided by the HEIs





A common Student E-ID at EU scale

Principle: relies on the identification specific to each country or institution

Model = SEPA (single euro payment area) method: IBAN and BIC model

- Unique European student identification (ESI) may consist of 2 items:
 - Country code
 - HEI: PIC code (European Institution Code)
 - SI (Student identification): < student identification code given by home institution>






