### Call for Presentations

The 40<sup>th</sup> European-French-German Colloquium, a European Student Services conference jointly arranged by DSW and the Crous, will be held August 25-29 by the Crous Strasbourg. With a view to current trends and challenges it is entitled

### **“Student life and Europe (social responsibility, citizenship, commitment, mobility)”.**

#### What is the conference about?

The following topics are scheduled for the colloquium:

- Panel 1: Campus Governance: how the student affairs and services organizations contribute to Campus life? What is their economic model ?
- Panel 2: Is hosting international students a European priority? How?
- Panel 3: Commitment of our student services for sustainable development;
- Panel 4: Student Engagement and organizations social responsibility;
- Panel 5: Innovative projects in student services in the areas such as student social responsibility, housing, dining services and administration – Examples of good practice.
- Panel 6: The European student card, the European universities, the mobility and the integration of the European higher education area?

#### Who can submit a proposal?

Everyone working within the field of “student affairs and services” at universities or other institutions is more than welcome to submit a proposal.

#### Why should I submit a proposal?

A useful outcome of the colloquium depends on the contributions and knowledge of the Student Services and related institutions. Every example of best practice or newly established project can be a motivating starting point for people around the world who still search for an interesting topic or a proven strategy for a new project. This is your chance to present the project you dedicated so much commitment and passion to in front of an international audience. Do not be concerned about the language, there will be interpreters ensuring that every participant will understand what you say.

#### What are the formats of a session at the conference?

You can choose between giving a presentation or a workshop. A presentation should fill around 10 to 20 min to give time for questions and discussion afterwards. The workshop takes a bit more time (60 to 90 min) involving also practical input from the participants.
